collection of essays and art by scholars artists and activists both in and out of prison that reveal the many dimensions of women s incarcerated experiences mary bosworth and jeanne flavin bring together twelve original essays by prominent scholars to examine not only the discrimination that is evident but also the structural and cultural forces that have influenced and continue to perpetuate the current situation contributors point to four major factors that have impacted public sentiment and criminal justice policy colonialism slavery immigration and globalization in doing so they reveal how practices of punishment not only need particular ideas about race to exist but they also legitimate them the essays unearth troubling evidence that testifies to america s brutally racist past and to white america s continued fear of and suspicion about racial and ethnic minorities the legacy of slavery on punishment is considered but also subjects that have received far less attention such as how colonizers notions of cultural superiority shaped penal practices the criminalization of reproductive rights the link between citizenship and punishment and the global export of crime control strategies can scholars generate knowledge and pedagogies that bolster local and global forms of resistance to u s imperialism racial gender oppression and the economic violence of capitalist globalization this book explores what happens when scholars create active engagements between the academy and communities of resistance in so doing it suggests a new direction for antiracist and feminist scholarship rejecting models of academic radicalism that remain unaccountable to grassroots social movements the authors explore the community and the academy as interlinked sites of struggle this book provides models and the opportunity for critical reflection for students and faculty as they struggle to align their commitments to social justice with their roles in the academy at the same time they explore the tensions and challenges of engaging in such contested work what is a canadian critical race feminism as the contributors to this book note the interventions of canadian critical race feminists work to explicitly engage the canadian state as a white settler society the collection examines indigenous peoples within the canadian settler state and indigenous women within feminism the challenges posed by the settler state for women of colour and indigenous women and the possibilities and limits of an anti colonial praxis critical race feminism like critical race theory more broadly interrogates questions about race and gender through an emancipatory lens posing fundamental questions about the persistence if not magnification of race and the colour line in the twenty first century the writers

of these articles whether exploring campus politics around issues of equity the media s circulation of ideas about a tolerant multicultural and feminist canada security practices that confine people of colour to spaces of exception indigenous women s navigation of both nationalism and feminism western feminist responses to the war on terror or the new forms of whiteness that persist in ideas about a post racial world or in transnational movements for social justice insist that we must study racialized power in all its gender and class dimensions the contributors are all members of researchers and academics of colour for equity contesting race and citizenship is an original study of black politics and varieties of political mobilization in italy although there is extensive research on first generation immigrants and refugees who traveled from africa to italy there is little scholarship about the experiences of black people who were born and raised in italy camilla hawthorne focuses on the ways italians of african descent have become entangled with processes of redefining the legal racial cultural and economic boundaries of italy and by extension of europe itself contesting race and citizenship opens discussions of the so called migrant crisis by focusing on a generation of black people who although born or raised in italy have been thrust into the same racist xenophobic political climate as the immigrants and refugees who are arriving in europe from the african continent hawthorne traces not only mobilizations for national citizenship but also the more capacious transnational black diasporic possibilities that emerge when activists confront the ethical and political limits of citizenship as a means for securing meaningful lasting racial justice possibilities that are based on shared critiques of the racial state and shared histories of racial capitalism and colonialism this handbook brings together the voices of a range of contributors interested in the many varied experiences of women in criminal justice systems and who are seeking to challenge the status quo although there is increasing literature and research on gender and certain aspects of the criminal justice system often western focused there is a significant gap in the form of a handbook that brings together these important gendered conversations this essential book explores research and theory on how women are perceived handled and experience criminal justice within and across different jurisdictions with particular consideration of gendered and disparate treatment of women as law breakers there is also consideration of women s experiences through an intersectional lens including race and class as well as feminist scholarship and activism the handbook contains 47 unique chapters with nine overarching themes lessons from history and theory routes into the criminal justice system intersectionality sentencing and the courts and community punishments specific offences incarcerated women s experiences mothers and families rehabilitation and reintegration practitioner relationships and each theme includes contributions from different countries as well as the experiences of contributors from different stages in their own journey international and interdisciplinary in scope this handbook is essential reading for scholars and students of criminology sociology social policy social work and law it will also be of interest to practitioners such as social workers probation officers prison officers and policy makers women s incarceration is on the rise globally and this has significant intergenerational economic and humanitarian costs for communities across the world while there have been efforts to implement reform particularly in countries such as canada uk us and australia the growing evidence suggests women s prisons and the support structures surrounding them are in crisis this collection of critical essays presents groundbreaking research on women s post imprisonment policy practice and experiences it is the first collection to offer international perspectives on gender criminalisation the effects of imprisonment and women centred approaches to the short and long term support of women exiting prison it offers cutting edge insights into contemporary policy developments and women s experiences across the us the uk australia canada and northern ireland the collection makes two important contributions first it marks a departure from an instrumental and individual focus on what works to reduce women s offending and re offending behaviour a prevailing approach within competing collections

focused on post release issues second it presents critical original research with robust empirical foundations to revive feminist criminological engagement around gender imprisonment and most critically post release management support and survival the collection will appeal to academics and community based advocates activists lawyers and practitioners engaged in advocacy and service provision for imprisoned women it is also an important and unique analysis for undergraduate and postgraduate students studying criminological and social science courses particularly those related to gender and crime imprisonment and correctional policy and qualitative research methods a critical perspective on the treatment of incarcerated women and their children inside and out women prison and therapy challenges conventional thinking about the therapeutic issues facing female prisoners and their children therapists counselors scholars and activists examine the injustices of the criminal justice system and the roles feminist therapists can play in deconstructing and demystifying the lives of women prisoners by becoming more involved in clinical work inside and out women prison and therapy examines this growing problem from a feminist perspective debunking stereotypes about women perpetrators with a thorough examination of gender responsive treatment of women in a variety of settings this unique book includes a macro analysis of gender and criminality an assessment of violence and the abuse of women parenting and the impact of incarceration on children treatment approaches developed specifically for women prisoners and an outline of what women need when leaving prison life the book also examines crucial issues facing women prisoners including sexual abuse and assault substance abuse mental and physical health concerns human rights violence discrimination and the unique problems of women prisoners of color topics addressed in inside and out women prison and therapy include designing and delivering gender responsive programs for women developing therapeutic measures to correct and normalize marginalized women mistreatment of women prisoners in the united states domestic violence and its connection to criminalization counseling sexually abused women motherhood crime and prison the effects of incarceration on children and families women addiction and incarceration using drama therapy with incarcerated women feminist support groups transitioning after release from prison and much more inside and out women prison and therapy is a vital professional resource for therapists and counselors who work with female prisoners and their families this book compiles research on female crime and delinquency in portugal in order to critically and reflectively explore interdisciplinary views on the link between gender crime and delinquency contributions are organized into two main parts with part i dedicated to the relationship between women and crime and part ii focused on female juvenile delinquency through the exploration of girls and women s relationships with delinquency and crime as well as with the justice system this original and compelling collection highlights the heterogeneity of girls and women s experiences whilst also underlining the convergences and divergences between them ultimately gomes and duarte argue that understanding how women and girls explain their offending behaviours and how they relate to the criminal justice system is of the utmost importance for reforming social and legal policies as such this book will be of value not only for students researchers and professionals of the social behavioural and criminal sciences but also for policy makers seeking to provide greater efficiency in preventing crime and delinquency throughout the world from the united states to tanzania chechnya and sri lanka people increasingly work together and take actions to improve their lives end inequality and change global society action groups and movements see dialogue and learning as important ways to extend democracy and with their inclusiveness remake society by putting strategy with theory local groups and movements are able to begin making changes in civil society and institutions that allow people to begin living in new ways written for activists people and students interested in change this book takes readers on a journey of discovery as it shows how various groups have brought theory and action together to make urban rural and transnational change the case studies and explanatory articles reveal how

liberties in the united states this state of the art collection tells a different story while progress has been made in marriage equality reproductive rights access to birth control and other areas government and civil society are waging a war on stigmatized sex by means of law surveillance and social control the contributors document the history and operation of sex offender registries and the criminalization of hiv as well as highly punitive measures against sex work that do more to harm women than to combat human trafficking they reveal that sex crimes are punished more harshly than other crimes while new legal and administrative regulations drastically restrict who is permitted to have sex by examining how the ever intensifying war on sex affects both privileged and marginalized communities the essays collected here show why sexual liberation is indispensable to social justice and human rights contributors alexis agathocleous elizabeth bernstein j wallace borchert mary anne case owen daniel mccarter scott de orio david m halperin amber hollibaugh trevor hoppe hans tao ming huang regina kunzel roger n lancaster judith levine laura mansnerus erica r meiners r noll melissa petro carol queen penelope saunders sean strub maurice tomlinson gregory tomso in 1974 women imprisoned at new york s maximum security prison at bedford hills staged what is known as the august rebellion protesting the brutal beating of a fellow prisoner the women fought off guards holding seven of them hostage and took over sections of the prison while many have heard of the 1971 attica prison uprising the august rebellion remains relatively unknown even in activist circles resistance behind bars is determined to challenge and change such oversights as it examines daily struggles against appalling prison conditions and injustices resistance documents both collective organizing and individual resistance among women incarcerated in the u s emphasizing women s agency in resisting the conditions of their confinement through forming peer education groups clandestinely arranging ways for children to visit mothers in distant prisons and raising public awareness about their lives resistance seeks to spark further discussion and research into the lives of incarcerated women and galvanize much needed outside support for their struggles this updated and revised edition of the 2009 pass award winning book includes a new chapter about transgender transsexual intersex and gender variant people in prison global lockdown is the first book to apply a transnational feminist framework to the study of criminalization and imprisonment the distinguished contributors to this collection offer a variety of perspectives from former prisoners to advocates to scholars from around the world the book is a must read for anyone concerned by mass incarceration and the growth of the prison industrial complex within and beyond u s borders as well as those interested in globalization and resistance the united states currently has the largest prison population on the planet over the last four decades structural unemployment concentrated urban poverty and mass homelessness have also become permanent features of the political economy these developments are without historical precedent but not without historical explanation in this searing critique jordan t camp traces the rise of the neoliberal carceral state through a series of turning points in u s history including the watts insurrection in 1965 the detroit rebellion in 1967 the attica uprising in 1971 the los angeles revolt in 1992 and events in post katrina new orleans in 2005 incarcerating the crisis argues that these dramatic events coincided with the emergence of neoliberal capitalism and the state s attempts to crush radical social movements through an examination of the poetic visions of social movements including those by james baldwin marvin gaye june jordan josé ramírez and sunni patterson it also suggests that alternative outcomes have been and continue to be possible global gender issues in the new millennium argues that the power of gender works to help keep gender race class sexual and national divisions in place despite increasing attention to gender issues in the study and practice of world politics accessible and student friendly for both undergraduate and graduate courses authors anne sisson runyan and v spike peterson analyze gendered divisions of power and resources that contribute to the worldwide crises of representation violence and sustainability they emphasize how hard won attention to gender equality in world affairs can be

co opted when gender is used to justify or mystify unjust forms of global governance international security and global political economy in the new and updated fourth edition runyan and peterson examine the challenges of forging transnational solidarities to de gender world politics scholarship and practice through renewed politics for greater representation and redistribution yet they see promise in coalitional struggles to re radicalize feminist world political demands to change the downward conditions of women men children and the planet updated to include framing questions at the opening of each chapter discussion questions and exercises at the end of each chapter and updated data on gender statistics and policymaking chapters one and two have also been revised to provide more support to readers with less of a background in gender politics case studies and web resources are now also provided race and crime presents students with a comprehensive analysis of the issues relating to race and crime in the us the book is illustrated with numerous photographs and exercises based on internet research are included this book presents a feminist historical materialist analysis of the ways in which the law policing and penal regimes have overlapped with social policies to coercively discipline the poor and marginalized sectors of the population throughout the history of capitalism roberts argues that capitalism has always been underpinned by the use of state power to discursively construct and materially manage those sectors of the population who are most resistant to and marginalized by the instantiation and deepening of capitalism the book reveals that the law along with social welfare regimes have operated in ways that are highly gendered as gender along with race has been a key axis along which difference has been constructed and regulated it offers an important theoretical and empirical contribution that disrupts the tendency for mainstream and critical work within ipe to view capitalism primarily as an economic relation roberts also provides a feminist critique of the failure of mainstream and critical scholars to analyse the gendered nature of capitalist social relations of production and social reproduction exploring a range of issues related to the nature of the capitalist state the creation and protection of private property the governance of poverty the structural compulsions underpinning waged work and the place of women in paid and unpaid labour this book is of great use to students and scholars of ipe gender studies social work law sociology criminology global development studies political science and history this book examines the drug dealer in contemporary society from an interdisciplinary perspective and considers the increasingly blurred demarcation between illegitimate and legitimate drug markets it explores the motives and drivers of those involved in drug supply and dispels common and stereotypical myths and misconceptions surrounding illegal drug markets and those who operate within them the drug dealer has become one of our foremost contemporary folk devils those who trade in substances prohibited by law are the subject of array of inaccurate myths and urban legends criminology has tended either to shoehorn drug dealers into neat typologies or portray them as victims of an uncaring predatory post modern society in reality we know relatively little about the complex and diverse world of drug markets and our concentration inevitably falls on low end retail dealers who operate in the most visible sectors of the illegal economy bringing together an international group of experts this book considers perspectives from around the world including uk usa south america spain india and australia this book will be of interest to students and researchers across criminology law sociology criminal justice and public health and will be essential reading for those taking courses on drugs drug markets and substance misuse the second edition of the handbook on prisons provides a completely revised and updated collection of essays on a wide range of topics concerning prisons and imprisonment bringing together three of the leading prison scholars in the uk as editors this new volume builds on the success of the first edition and reveals the range and depth of prison scholarship around the world the handbook contains chapters written not only by those who have established and developed prison research but also features contributions from ex prisoners prison governors and ex governors prison inspectors and others who have worked with
