The Ballad of Big Bob 1990 on a snowy winter morning in 1961 robert zimmerman left minnesota for new york city with a suitcase guitar harmonica and a few bucks in his pocket wasting no time upon arrival he performed at the cafe wha in his first day in the city under the name bob dylan over the next decade the cultural milieu of greenwich village would foster the emergence of one of the greatest songwriters of all time from the coffeehouses of macdougal street to andy warhol s factory dylan honed his craft by drifting in and out of new york s thriving arts scenes of the 1960s and early 70s in this revised edition originally published in 2011 author june skinner sawyers captures the thrill of how a city shaped an american icon and the people and places that were the touchstones of a legendary journey

Three Songs, Three Singers, Three Nations 1979 ballads are a fascinating subject of study not least because of their endless variety it is quite remarkable that ballads taken down or recorded from singers separated by centuries in time and by hundreds of kilometres in distance should be both different and yet recognizably the same in the english traditional ballad david atkinson examines the ways in which the body of ballads known in england make reference both to ballads from elsewhere and to other english folk songs the book outlines current theoretical directions in ballad scholarship structuralism traditional referentiality genre and context print and oral transmission and the theory of tradition and revival these are combined to offer readers a method of approaching the central issue in ballad studies the creation of meanings out of ballad texts atkinson focuses on some of the most interesting problems in ballad studies the wit combat in versions of the unquiet grave variable perspectives in comic ballads about marriage incest as a ballad theme problems of feminine motivation in ballads like the outlandish knight and the broomfield hill murder ballads and murder in other instances of early popular literature through discussion of these issues and themes in ballad texts the book outlines a way of tracing traditions in english balladry while recognizing that ballad tradition is far from being simply chronological and linear

The Rose & the Briar 2005 bob dylan was awarded the nobel prize in literature in june 2016 and seldom in recent years has it been more richly deserved that a song writer s lyrics should be regarded as literature was an idea at which many were surprised others have felt that to isolate the lyrics of a song from its musical context is unreal ultimately that is true a song is an indefeasible whole an inseparable marriage of words and music which achieves its overall emotional effect by that symbiosis and not otherwise yet it can also be said that the two components can be separately considered as two elements in the artist s creative utterance and discussed as such the evidence of dylan s manuscripts supports the view that in writing his lyrics his way of going about things is not always widely different from that of a poet bob dylan commented on the nobel prize in literature which was awarded to him for having created new poetic expressions within the great american song tradition when i first received this nobel prize for literature i got to wondering exactly how my songs related to literature i wanted to reflect on it and see where the connection was voice without restraint refers to and is from the song i dreamed i saw st augustine on john wesley harding and is a phrase chosen to evoke the full blooded commitment to his artistic utterance which is the hallmark of bob dylan s voice in all senses
