psychological distress due to maladaptive personality patterns styles and traits landmark events such as the 50th anniversary of the eisenhower commission report and the same anniversary of the community mental health act helped launch the community mental health movement the rehabilitation act of 1973 and the president's new freedom commission have continued this work by establishing funding sources and highlighting the importance of recovery and excellence in care modern community mental health an interdisciplinary approach integrates each of the key concepts contained within the presidential reports and landmark legislation into the context of today's community service delivery system this pathfinding textbook promises to revolutionize community mental health training by structured formats that meet the best practices criteria for trauma informed care safety self regulation trauma integration healthy relationships and healthy environments each chapter contains short excerpts case examples and commentary relevant to the chapter topic from recognized leaders in the field of trauma intervention with children and adolescents in addition to this readers will find chapters filled with easily applied activities methods and approaches to assessment self regulation trauma integration and resilience building the book's structured yet comprehensive approach provides professionals with the resources they need to help trauma victims not just survive but thrive and move from victim thinking to survivor thinking using the current best practices in the field the book is designed as a user friendly textbook manual for mental health professionals it teaches a trauma informed treatment approach as an organizing framework for a series of empirically supported interventions including motivational interviewing cognitive behavioral skills training trauma resolution and relapse prevention although it notes the importance of a systemic treatment approach the focus is on the individual component of treatment humanising mental health care in australia is a unique and innovative contribution to the healthcare literature that outlines the trauma informed approaches necessary to provide a more compassionate model of care for those who suffer with mental illness the impact of abuse and trauma is frequently overlooked in this population to the detriment of both individual and society this work highlights the importance of recognising such a history and responding humanely the book explores the trauma informed perspective across four sections the first outlines theory constructs and effects of abuse and trauma the second section addresses the effects of abuse and trauma on specific

populations the third section outlines a diverse range of individual treatment approaches the final section takes a broader perspective examining the importance of culture and training as well as the more likely to exhibit pronounced symptoms and consequences including substance abuse mental illness and health problems subsequently trauma can significantly affect how an individual engages in major life areas as well as treatment this tip provides evidence based and best practice information for behavioral health service providers and administrators who want to work more effectively with people who have been exposed to acute and chronic traumas and or are at risk of developing traumatic stress reactions using key trauma informed principles this tip addresses trauma related prevention
