if you take a pencil you can draw two cats but then what do the cats do full of exciting adventure and imagination this surreal charming counting book will take you on a journey that anyone can go on if they take a pencil set in the near future the wanting seed is a malthusian comedy about the strange world overpopulation will produce tristram foxe and his wife beatrice joanna live in their skyscraper world where official family limitation glorifies homosexuality eventually their world is transformed into a chaos of cannibalistic dining clubs fantastic fertility rituals and wars without anger it is a novel both extravagantly funny and grimly serious fiction for lovers is a collection of short stories depicting human intimacy as a stage for aggressive and violent deterioration vivisection traditionally held as a repellent and punishable act becomes a progressive marital aid worms the size of buildings bugs numbering in the millions and the partial logic of appearance are combined in new and refreshing ways making fiction for lovers another must read from the pen of this popular writer a view from a hill is the complete untold story of the chameleons and a cautionary tale of music business trickery from the clever pen of post punk legend burgess the band s lead singer applause books anthony burgess was the author of over 50 books including his best known novel a clockwork orange but burgess always emphasized music as the ruling passion in his creative life largely self taught in music burgess composed his first symphony before he was twenty many years before his first novel and he was the composer of over 65 musical works in these deeply insightful meditations the renowned writer explores the meaning of music the intention of the composer and the process of composition and the seemingly elusive relationships between literature and music burgess shows how the process of literary composition are revealed by the writers themselves and then gathers evidence to understand the inexplicable magic of the details of the operation of music what is music s intelligibility from shakespeare to the lyric verse of gerard manley hopkins from the modernists t s eliot and james joyce to the modern lyricists lorenz hart and stephen sondheim burgess reveals how prose writers have struggled to tap the inherent musicality of their material this treasured classic at last back in print provides a fascinating perspective on the mutually enriching relationship of these two creative arts by a man who mastered them both the world of tony burgess is savage and blackly funny it s a place where you shouldn t trust anybody not even your narrator uptown idaho winter is a boy who through no fault of his own is loathed by everyone in his town his father feeds him roadkill for breakfast the

kurt vonnegut s masterpiece slaughterhouse five is a desperate painfully honest attempt to confront the monstrous crimes of the twentieth century time selected by the modern library as one of the 100 best novels of all time slaughterhouse five an american classic is one of the world s great antiwar books centering on the infamous world war ii firebombing of dresden the novel is the result of what kurt vonnegut described as a twenty three year struggle to write a book about what he had witnessed as an american prisoner of war it combines historical fiction science fiction autobiography and satire in an account of the life of billy pilgrim a barber s son turned draftee turned optometrist turned alien abductee as vonnegut had billy experiences the destruction of dresden as a pow unlike vonnegut he experiences time travel or coming unstuck in time an instant bestseller slaughterhouse five made kurt vonnegut a cult hero in american literature a reputation that only strengthened over time despite his being banned and censored by some libraries and schools for content and language but it was precisely those elements of vonnegut s writing the political edginess the genre bending inventiveness the frank violence the transgressive wit that have inspired generations of readers not just to look differently at the world around them but to find the confidence to say something about it
