level tells a traditional story about three generations of a fantastic absurd lovable immigrant family blessed and cursed with generous doses of tragedy and high comedy but there s a provocative twist cal the narrator also callie is a hermaphrodite and the explanation for this takes us spooling back in time through a breathtaking review of the twentieth century to 1922 when the turks sacked smyrna and callie s grandparents fled for their lives back to a tiny village in asia minor where two lovers and one rare genetic mutation set our narrator s life in motion middlesex is a grand utterly original fable of crossed bloodlines the intricacies of gender and the deep untidy promptings of desire it s a brilliant exploration of divided people divided families divided cities and nations the connected halves that make up ourselves and our world this story of the unlikely meeting of two vulnerable women is a beautifully woven page turner the battle weary woman and the pin up girl who meet connect separate each changed by the brief union heather morris author of the 1 new york times bestseller the tattooist of auschwitz a dazzling work of historical fiction based on true events about two women who seem the most unlikely to ever meet alice a korean war survivor and translator for the american forces in seoul and marilyn monroe who is visiting korea on a four day uso tour february 1954 although the korean war armistice was signed a year ago most citizens of seoul still battle to return to some semblance of normalcy conditions are dismal children beg for food and orphanages are teeming alice j kim a korean translator and typist for the american forces still sanctioned in the city yearns for the life she used to live before her country was torn apart then alice s boss makes an announcement the american movie star marilyn monroe will be visiting korea on a four day uso tour and alice has been chosen as her translator though intrigued alice has few expectations of the job what could she and a beautiful actress at the peak of her fame possibly have to talk about yet the marilyn she meets while just as dazzling and sensual as alice expected is also surprisingly approachable as marilyn s visit unfolds alice is forced into a reckoning with her own painful past moving and mesmerizing the starlet and the spy is a beautiful portrayal of unexpected kinship between two very different women and of the surprising connections that can change or even save a life fifteen years ago in 1975 genna hewett meade s college roommate died a mysterious violent terrible death minette swift had been a fiercely individualistic scholarship student an assertive even prickly personality and one of the few black girls at an exclusive women s liberal arts college near philadelphia by contrast genna was a quiet self effacing teenager from a privileged upper class home self consciously struggling to make amends for her own elite upbringing when partway through their freshman year minette suddenly fell victim to an increasing torrent of racist harassment and vicious slurs from within the apparent safety of their tolerant enlightened campus genna felt it her duty to protect her roommate at all costs now as genna reconstructs the months weeks and hours leading up to minette s tragic death she is also forced to confront her own identity within the social framework of that time her father was a prominent civil defense lawyer whose radical politics including defending anti war terrorists wanted by the fbi would deeply affect his daughter s outlook on life and later challenge her deepest beliefs about social obligation in a morally gray world black girl white girl is a searing double portrait of black and white of race and civil rights in post vietnam america captured by one of the most important literary voices of our time finalist for the dayton literary peace prize a washington post best book of the year winner of the 2009 borders original voices award in early twentieth century korea najin han the privileged daughter of a calligrapher longs to choose her own destiny but her country is in tumult under japan s harsh occupation and her family s traditions entitlements and wealth crumble narrowly escaping an arranged marriage najin becomes a companion to a young princess until korea s last king is assassinated and the centuries old dynastic culture comes to its end najin pursues a coveted education and is surprised to find love after one day of marriage a denied passport separates her from her new husband who journeys alone to america as a decade passes and the world descends into war najin loses touch with her husband will the love they share be enough to sustain her through the deprivation her country continues to endure the calligrapher s daughter is a vivid heartfelt portrait of faith love and life for one family during a pivotal time in history bookpage in a strangely distorted paris a japanese adoptee is haunted by the woman he once loved when fumiko emerges after one month locked in her dorm room she s already dead leaving a half smoked marlboro light and a cupboard of petrified food in her wake for her boyfriend henrik blatand an aspiring translator these remnants are like clues propelling him forward in a search for meaning meanwhile fumiko or perhaps her doppelgänger reappears in line at the louvre on street corners and subway platforms and on the dissection table of a group of medical students henrik s inquiry expands beyond fumiko s seclusion and death across the absurd entropic streets of paris and the figures that wander them from a jaded group of korean expats to an eccentric french widow to the indelible woman whom henrik finds sitting in his place on a train it drives him into the shadowy corners of his past where his adoptive danish parents raised him in a house without mirrors and it mounts to a charged intimacy shared with his best friend s precocious daughter who may be haunted herself david hoon kim s debut is a transgressive darkly comic novel of becoming lost and found in translation with each successive echoic chapter paris is a party paris is a ghost plunges us more deeply beneath the surface of things to the displacement exile grief and desire that hide in plain sight
