humanitarian response as a category that unsettles challenges and critical engages with political ethical and epistemological questions responsibility is central to anthropological theory ethnographic practice collaborative research applied engagement with chapters focused on a variety of cultural contexts volume considers how anthropology can contribute to a better understanding responsibility including the responsibility of anthropology and the responsibility of anthropologists to specific others the fraught relationship between saudi arabia and iran is usually attributed to sectarian differences even by the states of the region however this book shows that in their official speeches newspaper editorials friday sermons these elites use sectarian and nationalist references and tend to denigrate each other and promote themselves in the eyes of their respective constituencies in the region talal mohammad who is fluent in both arabic and persian examines saudi iranian rivalry using discourse analysis of these religious political and journalistic sources tracing what has been produced since 1979 in parallel he argues for a consistent pattern of mutual misrepresentation where each frames its counterpart as the other to which a specific political agenda is justified and advanced the book covers key events including the iranian revolution the invasion of kuwait in 1990 the taliban war the fall of saddam the arab spring the rise of mohammed bin salman and the war on isis while until now saudi iranian rivalry has been understood in primarily sectarian or geopolitical terms the author argues here that the discursive othering serves as a propagandist function that supports more fundamental political and geopolitical considerations this book analyzes the everyday lives of labour migrants in a rapidly developing city using the emirate of dubai as a case study migrant dubai shows that even under highly restrictive mobility regimes marginalized migrants find ways to cope with structural inequalities and quotidian modes of discrimination in responsibility to protect and women peace and security aligning the protection agendas edith e davies zim nwokora eli stamnes and sarah teitt address the intersections of responsibility to protect r2p principle and the women peace and security wps agenda contributions from policy makers and academics consider both the challenges and the utility of aligning the protection agendas of r2p and wps a number of actionable recommendations are made concerning a unification of the agendas that best support the global empowerment of women and the prevention of major atrocities this book systematically explores the emerging legal discipline of transnational system law esl challenging the closed system of law and marking a new era in law and society scholarship law has historically provided stability certainty and predictability in the ordering of social relations predominantly between human

however in recent decades the earth's relationship in law has changed with increasing recognition of the standing of mother earth inherent rights of the environment such as flora and fauna rivers and now recognition of the mutual relations of the anthropocene this book questions the fundamental assumption that the law only applies to humans and that the earth as a system has intrinsic rights and responsibilities in the last ten years the planet has experienced its hottest period since human evolution and by the year 2100 unless substantive action is taken many species will be lost and planetary conditions will be intolerable for human civilisation as it currently exists relationships between humans the biosphere and all planetary systems must change the authors address these challenging topics setting the groundwork of esl to ensure sustainable development of the coupled socio ecological system that the earth has become earth system is an interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research project and as such the book will be of great interest to researchers and stakeholders from a wide range of disciplines including political science anthropology economics law ethics sociology and psychology over the last decade the question of the relationship between organisations and society has been subject to much debate often of a critical nature the decade has seen protests concerning the actions of organisations exposing corporate exploitation and unfolding accounting scandals at the same time a concern for the environment have been shown to have a positive correlation with corporate performance the nature of corporate social responsibility is therefore a topical one for businesses and academics there are however many different perspectives upon what is meant by corporate social responsibility and how this might be applied within organisations this book explores some of these different perspectives based upon the experiences of different people in different parts of the world there has been much written about globalisation some of it positive and much of it negative it is a subject which arouses definite opinions despite the fact that the word globalisation is part of the title of this book it is not our intention to contribute to this debate instead we use the word globalisation in its original sense to represent the ubiquity of the concept for corporate social responsibility csr which is the subject matter of this book specifically we are concerned with the social contract between an organisation and its stakeholders it is apparent that any actions which an organisation undertakes will have an effect not just upon itself but also upon the external environment within which that organisation resides in considering the effect of the organisation upon its external environment it must be recognised that this environment includes both the business environment in which the firm is operating the local social

environment in which the organisation is located and the wider global environment. Effectively therefore there is a social contract between organizations and their stakeholders. Recognition of the rights of all stakeholders and the duty of organizations to be accountable in this wider context therefore has been largely a relatively recent phenomenon. The economic view of accountability only to owners has recently been subject to debate to any considerable extent. In the current environment there is a need to debate this issue and its implications. This book therefore recognises the international scope of the interest in corporate social responsibility both through the contributions made by the authors of the various chapters who come from various parts of the world and also through the international importance of the perspectives offered by these contributors. So the various authors demonstrate that corporations are a part of society, much as each of us is as an individual. Furthermore they demonstrate that the issues and concerns are not local ones but are international in scope and concern. The contributions to this book provide a representation of the range of corporate social responsibility and the range of topics which fall within the subject matter. Among the authors who have contributed to this book are representatives from every continent and from a wide range of disciplines. The topics which are considered in the various chapters are equally diverse.
