embodied the revolutionary spirit of france and as shafer shows although artaud was immensely productive he struggled profoundly with his creative process hindered by narcotics addiction increasing paranoia and an overwhelming sense of alienation situating artaud s contributions within the frenzy of his life and that of the twentieth century at large this book is a compelling and fresh biography edition of shakespeare s plays when the first folio hit the bookstalls in 1623 nearly eight years after the dramatist s death it provided eighteen previously unpublished plays and significantly revised versions of close to a dozen other dramatic works many of which may not have survived without the efforts of those who backed financed curated and crafted what is arguably one of the most important conservation projects in literary history without the first folio shakespeare is unlikely to have acquired the towering international stature he now enjoys across the arts the pedagogical arena and popular culture its lasting impact on english national heritage as well as its circulation across cultures languages and media makes the first folio the world s most influential secular book but who were the personalities behind the project and did shakespeare himself play a role in its inception shakespeare s book the story behind the first folio and the making of shakespeare charts for desperate men uneasy allies in a baffling foreign land are pitted against a band of ruthless criminals there s bad traffic ahead the popular actors recount their three month 20 000 mile motorbike journey from

london to new york through three continents and some of the harshest terrain on earth when a new chatty young couple and their two daughters move in next door oves well ordered solitary world turns upside down in all their postings maurice and katie enthusiastically explored their surroundings on foot by canoe or by dog team camping in tents or igloos and relishing the spectacular landscapes first produced in 1925 hay fever is technically a masterpiece a comedy of bad manners which starts with the arrival of four guests invited independently by different members of the bliss family for a weekend at their country house near maidenhead the promise of an idyllic and peaceful weekend is quickly trounced by the self absorbed eccentricities of the family who leave the guests to slink away
