this book explores the relationship between gender and power in burmese history from pre colonial times to the present day and aims to identify the sources nature and limitations of women s power the study takes as its starting point the apparent contradiction that though burmese women historically enjoyed relatively high social status and economic influence for the most part they remained conspicuously absent from positions of authority in formal religious social and political institutions the book thus examines the concept of family in burmese political culture and reveals how some women were able to gain political influence through their familial connections with powerful men even while cultural models of correct female behaviour prevented most women from attaining official positions of political authority the study also considers how various influences buddhism colonialism nationalism modernisation and militarism shaped burmese concepts of gender and power with important implications for how women were able to exercise social economic and political influence the book explores how the effects of prolonged armed conflict economic isolation and political oppression have constrained opportunities for women to attain power in contemporary burma and examines opportunities opened up by the pro democracy movement and recent focus on women s issues and rights for women to exercise influence both inside burma and in exile using an interdisciplinary approach that draws on feminist anthropological and social science discourses placing them within an historical framework the author offers a broad understanding of how power is obtained and exercised in burma in order to reassess historical representations of burmese women and so provide a more comprehensive and inclusive understanding of power relations in historical and contemporary burma this report is part of who s response to the 49th world health assembly held in 1996 which adopted a resolution declaring violence a major and growing public health problem across the world it is aimed largely at researchers and practitioners including health care workers social workers educators and law enforcement officials worldwide patterns of violence against women differ markedly from violence against men for example women are more likely than men to be sexually assaulted or killed by someone they know the united nations has defined violence against women as gender based violence to acknowledge that such violence is rooted in gender inequality and is often tolerated and condoned by laws institutions and community norms violence against women is not only a profound violation of human rights but also a costly impediment to a country s national development while gender based violence occurs in many forms throughout the life cycle this review focuses on two of the most common types physical intimate partner violence and sexual violence by any perpetrator unfortunately the knowledge base about effective initiatives to prevent and respond to gender based violence is relatively limited few approaches have been rigorously evaluated even in high income countries and such evaluations involve numerous methodological challenges nonetheless the authors review what is known about more and less effective or at least promising approaches to prevent and respond to gender based violence they present definitions recent statistics health consequences costs and risk factors of gender based violence the authors analyze good practice initiatives in the justice health and education sectors as well as multisectoral approaches for each of these sectors they examine initiatives that have addressed laws and policies institutional reforms community mobilization and individual behavior change strategies finally the authors identify priorities for future research and action including funding research on the health and socioeconomic costs of violence against women encouraging science based program evaluations disseminating evaluation results across countries promoting investment in effective prevention and treatment initiatives and encouraging public private partnerships the authors present an overview of gender based violence gbv in latin america with special emphasis on good practice interventions to prevent gbv or offer services to its survivors or perpetrators intimate partner violence and sexual coercion are the most common forms of gbv and these are the types of gbv that they analyze gbv has serious consequences for women s health and well being ranging from fatal outcomes such as homicide suicide and aids related deaths to nonfatal outcomes such as physical injuries chronic pain syndrome gastrointestinal disorders complications during pregnancy miscarriage and low birth weight of children gbv also poses significant costs for the economies of developing countries including lower worker productivity and incomes and lower rates of accumulation of human and social capital the authors examine good practice approaches in justice health education and multisectoral approaches in each sector they identify good practices for 1 law and policies 2 institutional reforms 3 community level interventions and 4 individual behavior change strategies cyber attacks are on the rise the media constantly report about data breaches and increasingly sophisticated cybercrime even governments are affected at the same time it is obvious that technology alone cannot solve the problem what can countries do which issues can be addressed by policies and legislation how to draft a good law the report assists countries in understanding what cybercrime is about what the challenges are in fighting such crime and supports them in drafting policies and laws according to conventional wisdom the national identity of the jordanian state was defined by the ruling hashemite family which has governed the country since the 1920s but this view overlooks the significant role that the arab street in this case ordinary jordanians and palestinians played and continues to play in defining national identity in jordan and the fertile crescent as a whole indeed as this pathfinding study makes clear the street no less than the state has been a major actor in the process of nation building in the middle east during and after the colonial era in this book betty anderson examines the activities of the jordanian national movement jnm a collection of leftist political parties that worked to promote pan arab unity and oppose the continuation of a separate jordanian state from the 1920s through the 1950s using primary sources including memoirs interviews poetry textbooks and newspapers as well as archival records she shows how the expansion of education new jobs in the public and private sectors changes in economic relationships the establishment of national militaries and the explosion of media outlets all converged to offer ordinary jordanians and palestinians who were under the jordanian government at the time an alternative sense of national identity anderson convincingly demonstrates that key elements of the jnm s pan arab vision and goals influenced and were ultimately adopted by the hashemite elite even though the movement itself was politically defeated in 1957 international human rights law is founded on the premise that all persons by virtue of their essential humanity should enjoy all human rights exceptional distinctions for example between citizens and non citizens can be made only if they serve a legitimate state objective and are proportional to the achievement of the objective non citizens can include migrants refugees and asylum seekers victims of trafficking foreign students temporary visitors and cold war might also mean the end of the refugee cycle both a breaking of the cycle of violence persecution and flight and the completion of the cycle for those able to return to their homes the 1990s it was hoped would become the decade of repatriation however although over nine million refugees were repatriated worldwide between 1991 and 1995 there are reasons to believe that it will not necessarily be a durable solution for refugees it certainly has become clear that the end of the refugee cycle has been much more complex and ultimately more elusive than expected the changing constructions and realities of refugee repatriation provide the backdrop for this book which presents new empirical research on examples of refugee repatriation and reconstruction apart from providing up to date material it also fills a more fundamental gap in the literature which has tended to be based on pedagogical reasoning rather than actual field research adopting a global perspective this volume draws together conclusions from highly varied experiences of refugee repatriation and defines repatriation and reconstruction as part of a wider and interrelated refugee cycle of displacement
