teacher ratios unpredictable funding and persistent questions regarding what refugee education is for the author shifts focus from debates over the impacts of specific policies and programs and explores instead how and why different policies and programs were implemented whether they led to meaningful changes in the long standing challenges of refugee education she finds that when and where real changes occurred individuals or small groups of refugees and policymakers acted with tremendous agency and as tireless advocates the role of higher education in establishing structures and
