In July of 2011, news broke of a scandal which involved hacking by the UK newspaper News of the World into the voicemails of a murder victim and of relatives of soldiers killed in Afghanistan and Iraq. Among others, the UK's top police official has resigned over the scandal, the Prime Minister's director of communications has been arrested, and the newspaper itself has been shut down by James Murdoch, CEO of the UK subsidiary which owned the paper. Despite all of this, the board of directors of the publicly traded US parent corporation, News Corporation, has been standing by as the scandal widens. While no director has publicly denounced News Corporation, as New York Times corporate critic Andrew Ross Sorkin would have expected, Thomas J. Perkins, director since 1996, has in fact publicly defended News Corporation. This is particularly curious.



because perkins had also sat on the board of hewlett packard and resigned from that position at the time accusing hp of hacking his personal cell and home phone records this article explores the function of the board of directors in light of the murdoch scandal with the working hypothesis that there is a link between the board being beholden to the ceo media mogul rupert murdoch in this case and how the board handled the corporate crisis after putting forth the various possibilities and factors this article will seek either to confirm the hypothesis or else to put forth an alternative explanation the heavy borrowing of rupert murdoch's publishing empire news corporation has been successful as a strategy in several ways here the authors examine the history of news corporation and offer their conclusion that in spite of its past success the net is now closing australian born billionaire rupert murdoch has consolidated his hold over the media and wider political debate in the uk america and australia according to businessweek his satellites deliver tv programs in five continents all but dominating britain italy and wide swaths of asia and the middleeast he publishes 175 newspapers and runs bskyb sky italia sky deutsch and foxtel in the u s a he owns the twentieth century fox studio fox network and 35 tv stations that reach more than 40 of the usa as well as many other companies the popular habit of reducing murdoch to caricature of a media mogul who will stop at nothing ignores the intrigues of his personality in all its contradictory dimensions drawn from decades of media coverage this book serves up the best most thought provoking insights into who rupert murdoch is
